We are pleased to update you on the current situation in Iraq as follows:

1. Latest News

New regulation for governmental cargo Iraqi Prime Minister Office has implemented a new regulation on July 1st stating that:

Effective from August 1st, 2017 all cargo imported to Iraq and belonging to governmental sector needs to be marked with following information:

- GOODS ARE
 EXEMPTED FROM
 DUTY AND TAX
- GOODS ARE NOT FOR SALE IN THE LOCAL MARKET
- CONSIGNEES NAME
 TO BE MENTIONED
- SHIPPERS NAME TO BE MENTIONED
- CONTRACT NUMER
 TO BE MENTIONED

The reason behind is that Iraqi Government wants to prevent leakage and trade of goods exempted from customs fees/duties in the free market.

We are going to follow up the situation and monitor the developments carefully.

► Abu Ghraib Customs
resume work again – other
domestic customs terminals
opened

Beside the border customs offices and airport customs offices the Iraqi government has opened new and reopened a few former domestic customs terminals. The domestic customs terminals have got the task to re-inspect shipments which have already been cleared at other customs points but which documents' show discrepancies or seem to be suspicious. Those shipments will be redirected to the domestic terminals like e.g. Abu Ghraib customs. The procedures there will be similar to customs clearance procedures at other customs points. After the re-inspection cargo will be released for

further delivery to final destination.

► <u>Update on Battle for</u> Mosul

The completed liberation of Mosul City has been announced by the Iraqi government a few weeks ago. The supply of aid equipment as well as smaller local rebuilding works are ongoing. Please note that road blockages and limitation in the road transport in the greater Mosul/Nineveh governorate area could be implemented on short notice by the Iraqi Authorities.

► <u>Ashura Road Blockages</u>

Road blockages are expected to start around September 15th and expected to be lifted around October 5th. We will inform you once the final dates are officially announced.
